to be Presented from**

Associate Superintendent Scott reported the Kern High School District entered into a energy use agreement 4 ½ years ago with Energy Education, Inc., and the District's cost savings have been credited to the principal's budgets of each high school. Mr. Marc Starkey, representing Energy Education, Inc., was present at the Board meeting to present a

*Environmental Excellence Award* to the Kern High School District. In doing so, he credited the efforts of four staff members in the District receiving this distinguished recognition: Larry Patrick, Director of Maintenance and Operations; Steve Tolin, Energy Manager for Maintenance and Operations; Dean Fussel, Heating, Venting and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Lead Technician; and, Clint Bland, Heating, Venting and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Assistant Lead Technician. Mr. Starkey reported “This District is one of the leading school districts in this country with their records in this program. In just over 51 months, the electricity use has been reduced by 81.0 kilo watt hours, 4,248 cars have been removed from the road and 6,000 pine trees planted as a result of this program.”

No communications were shared with Trustees at the Board meeting. Superintendent Carter reported that all communications received for the Board of Trustees have been forwarded to the Trustees under separate cover.

**HEARING OF CITIZENS**

**Hearing of Citizens**

Several Hearing of Citizen cards were submitted as a request to address the Board of Trustees all related to a recent incident involving Trustee Ken Mettler.

Roxanne Delmarter voiced support of Proposition 8 and expressed appreciation to Trustee Mettler for “...always making decisions based on good values. I hope that he will keep fighting the good fight no matter the cost.”

Jacque Sullivan reported she was at the Board meeting to show strong support for Trustee Mettler. “He is the type of Trustee we need. This is a conservative Board and committed to conservative values. We now no longer celebrate winter and spring, but back to Christmas and Easter.”

Jeff Burns reported he has known Trustee Mettler for over 40 years. “He works time and time again on what needs to be done. He is a great role model and has never been confrontational.”

Katie Stibor reported she was present because she is proud of what Trustee Mettler has done and was glad he stood his ground and didn’t get pushed around.

Sue Porter reported that videos can be misleading and “we all know he was pushed. This was blown clear out of proportion. It was immature to say that you don’t have a right to defend yourself when you have a crowd that is going rapidly after you.”

Mel Culbertson reported he was present because he believed in giving 100% to Trustee Mettler for his moral values and civic duty.

Melissa Porter and Pam Helms both submitted a request, but changed their minds about speaking when called to the podium by the Board President.

Mauricio Rodriguez, Jr. reported this issue was very important to him and reported that “Trustee Mettler is a good person. When we come up with our conservative views, we are attacked. We are attacked and when we defend ourselves, they only show one portion of it. I think that is very unfair and everybody needs to be given their equal time (referring to media reports).”

Karen Cason submitted a request, but changed her mind about speaking when called to the podium by the Board President.

Paul Georgi reported he personally witnessed the attack firsthand. After witnessing the attack he reported was both concerned and embarrassed. “I became increasingly worried that Trustee Mettler has a direct connection to our children. Do we have any reason to believe that our children would be safe. We are lucky that the person Trustee Mettler chose to attack was not one of our children.”

Mary Lee Wallace reported she did see the video in question. “The property that Mr. Mettler crossed the street to confiscate was not his. This is not a man that should represent anything to children. “When he reaches out himself and introduces himself as a board member of this school district, he is representing this district and he is standing in office when he introduces himself.”

David Garcia II reported his topic relates to Trustees Mettler and Vegas and reported “... their adoption of the In God We Trust is causing severe problems in the schools and hate ... I know several kids that attend East Bakersfield High School and other high schools and they are prosecuted and beat up. And I blame Chad Vegas and Ken Mettler for this. We are supposed to separate church and state..... What they are doing is causing more hate and more bias than they think they are doing. “

Kathryn Cecil reported she was there to make an official complaint against Board of Trustee member, Ken Mettler for assaulting a young man on October 24, 2008. “A young man who really doesn’t look any different than a high school student. A young child around the age of five witnessed the event. Mr. Mettler’s actions set a poor example for the students in our county, the same students he holds to his proud zero tolerance policy. For the district to ignore his actions because they were not committed on work time is irresponsible. Mr. Mettler should apologize to the community and step down from his elected position. As a voter, taxpayer and lifelong member of this community, I insist further action be taken on this matter.”

Douglas McAfee reported he was present at the Board meeting representing an organization called Peace Bakersfield. He told Trustees how he has participated in multiple demonstrations on the same corner as this incident and that this attack was the “...worst attack I have ever seen. There’s never been anything like it before. I’m asking that Ken Mettler be removed from his duties and he is unfit to serve.”

**Board of Trustee Reports and/or Inquiries**

Trustee Heinrichs asked about the status of a large career technical education grant application by the Kern High School District. Associate Superintendent Thompson reported his division expects to receive the response in the next couple of weeks.

Trustee Vegas encouraged everyone to get out and vote on Election Day. He also reported he had some guests present and reported he wanted to introduce them as representative members of the Hispanic community in our town. He asked them to come forward and be introduced. Javier Marquez and a local Hispanic pastor, Pastor Arnoldo Hernandez, addressed the Board of Trustees on their pleasure to be present and join in the sharing of the same values. Trustee Vegas reported that Trustee Mettler shares the same values as many people of our community from diverse backgrounds. Referring to what he terms an "unfortunate incident", Trustee Vegas commented, "While all of us know and believe that Ken should not have walked across the street, at the same time, a man has the right to defend himself from an attack."

**SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE**

**Proposed Schedule of Regular Meetings for the Board of Trustees for Calendar Year 2009**

A proposed schedule of Regular Meetings for Calendar Year 2009 was presented to the Board of Trustees as an informational item by Superintendent Carter. Regular Meetings of the Board of Trustees are usually scheduled for the first Monday of every month. However, in the calendar year 2009, there are some exceptions:

1. Two Regular Meetings have been scheduled in the month of March due to the Easter

Vacation schedule.

2. A Regular Meeting will be scheduled on the first Monday and the fourth Monday of June. There is no Regular Meeting in July due to vacation schedules throughout the District.
3. The September meeting has been scheduled on a Tuesday due to the Labor Day holiday.

A copy of the proposed Schedule of Regular Meetings for 2009 is on file with these official minutes. Trustees will be asked to take action to approve this meeting schedule at the 2008 Annual Organizational Meeting of the Board, scheduled for Monday, December 8, 2008.

A copy of the 2010 proposed schedule of Regular Meetings was also reviewed briefly by Superintendent Carter. Due to the holiday schedules, there will, once again, be exceptions to the tradition schedule of Regular Meetings held on the first Monday of the month.

**Selection of Date for

Board of Trustees**

The 2008 schedule of Regular Meetings was adopted by the Board of Trustees at the December 10, 2007 Annual Organizational Meeting. While it is past practice in the Kern High School District that the Annual Organizational Meeting is always held at the December Regular Meeting, the official identification of the date for the Annual Organizational Meeting is required to be selected by the governing board at its regular meeting held prior to the annual organizational meeting.

Education Code Section 35143 requires that each school district hold an annual organizational meeting within a 15-day period commencing on December 5, 2008 and concluding on December 20, 2008.

It was moved by Trustee Hampton, seconded by Trustee Vegas and unanimously carried that the 2008 Annual Organizational Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Kern High School District be scheduled as originally posted for Monday, December 8, 2008.

**2008-2009  
Recruitment Report**

The 2008-2009 Recruitment Report was presented by Assistant Superintendent Jones which included information related to recruitment and employment of certificated staff, resignations, retirements and transfers, and comparative recruitment information, as follows:

- Total certificated staff for the opening of the 2008-2009 school year was 1,978,

compared to 1,970 in 2007-2008 and 1,920 in 2006-2007.

- A total of 103 resignations/retirement notices were processed through September 30, 2008.
- Of the newly hired certificated staff, 19 were hired from California institutions, including 14 from California State University, Bakersfield.
- 157 were hired from other areas including Kern County school districts, other California school districts, Kern High School District substitute teachers, private industry, etc.
- A total of new certificated employees were hired from out-of-state institutions, including Central Michigan University, Eastern Michigan University, Illinois State University, Michigan State University, Northern Illinois University, and Western Michigan University.
- 142 certificated transfers were processed between high schools in the Kern High School District.
- A total of 349 applications were processed, and a total of 273 candidates were interviewed.
- The cost of recruitment for the 2008-09 school year was \$41,734 for staff expense and \$27,600 for moving allowances.

### BUSINESS SERVICES

#### Report of Study to Determine the Economic Viability of Future Installation of Trash Compactor/Waste Disposals

The Maintenance and Operations Department has installed trash compactors at South, Arvin, and Highland high schools, as well as at the District Support Facility. The Kern High School District spent approximately \$1.1 million in fiscal year 2007-2008 for waste disposal. A study has been undertaken to determine the economic viability of installing trash compactors at more District locations.

Expenditure data relating to South and Highland high schools on bin rental and waste disposal previously averaged \$72,000 per year, per site. Last year, these two sites participated in a program using a leased trash compactor. Under this program there is a one-time cost of approximately \$5,000 for a concrete pad, fencing, electrical supply and water. The annual lease and maintenance cost was \$12,000 per year and waste disposal fee of \$13,000 annually, for a total of \$25,000 per year for each site. The lease plan saved approximately \$35,000 for the first year, and the \$40,000 the year after, per site.

Additional benefits of the use of trash compactors include safety as there are fewer trucks on campus while students are on site and a reduction in the need for custodial staff to risk back injury by lifting trash containers to dumpster openings. Additional benefits include less loose trash drifting from the trash dumpsters resulting in a cleaner campus and also a time savings on the part of custodial staff. Director of Business, Bill Voss, reported an additional analysis has been undertaken as part of the bid process to determine whether an outright purchase of trash compactors would provide a better return on the District's investment than the current lease arrangements. The current lease arrangement allows the District to expedite installation of compactors without a large capital expenditure.

A Resolution of the Governing Board of the Kern High School District regarding the Confirmation of Threshold Use of Informal and Formal Bidding Procedures under the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act was presented for approval by Associate Superintendent Scott.

This resolution describes the increase in construction project values permitted to be let without competitive bidding, performed by force account, or let by informal procedures under the Act, and confirms the District's intent to permit the letting of construction contracts, performance of work by force account, or letting of construction contracts by informal procedures up to the maximum amounts permissible under the Act as it may be amended. It was moved by Trustee Hampton, seconded by Trustee Mettler and unanimously carried to approve the Resolution as presented. A copy of the approved Resolution is on file in the Business Division office.
